

DRUG FREE SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITY ACT STATEMENT

DePaul University complies with the requirements of the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act. DePaul has policies and procedures to prevent the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol by students and employees. This includes the Alcohol policy (<https://catalog.depaul.edu/student-handbooks/code-student-responsibility/university-policies-applicable-students/alcohol/>), the Illegal Use or Possession of Drugs or Controlled Substances policy (<https://catalog.depaul.edu/student-handbooks/code-student-responsibility/university-policies-applicable-students/illegal-use-possession-drugs-controlled-substances/>), and the Drug Free Workplace and Legal Drinking Age Compliance policy (<http://policies.depaul.edu/policy/policy.aspx?pid=259>).

DePaul distributes an annual notification to all students and employees that includes standards of conduct, sanctions under law and University policy, a description of the health risks association with alcohol and drug use, and a description of treatment programs. The University reviews its compliance on a biennial basis to determine its effectiveness and to ensure that the standards of conduct and conduct sanctions have been consistently enforced. This review is documented in a report.
